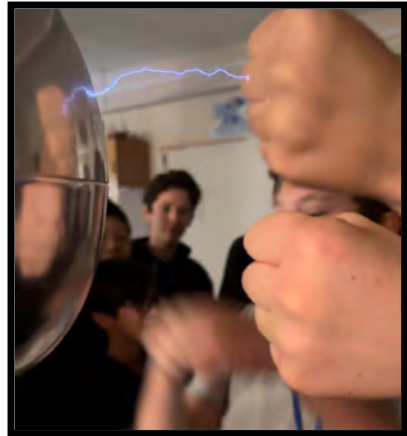

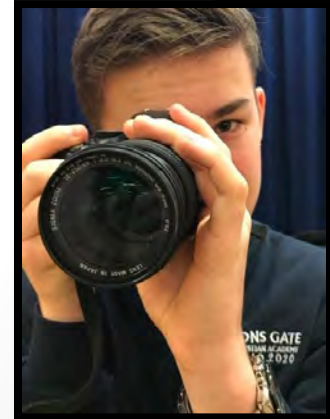

# What to Consider:



1. **Graduation Requirements**

2. **Post Secondary Plans** - The courses chosen in Grade 10, 11 & 12 will impact post secondary plans

3. **Elective Options at LGCA** - Course selection options depend on post secondary plans

- Our timetable is designed around what our students need so it is important to choose carefully

# Admission Requirements

## Broad-based admission trend.

Some program applications may require:

- Personal Profile (UBC)
- Supplemental applications
- Portfolios
- Interviews/Auditions
- Reference letters: leadership, school & community service

Students need to demonstrate reflective and engaged learning

- Course load as well as diversity is important (An LGCA graduate will have well beyond the minimum 80 credits)

- College/university level studies within the support of a high school environment.
- Demonstrate to post-secondary admissions officers that they have sought out an educational experience that will prepare them for success at college/university and beyond.
- Potentially earn an extra four credits towards transcript and may be able to enroll directly into the second year course at university.

# Personalized Education

- **Online Course** if not offered at school – Economics 12, Psychology 12, Computer Programing 12
- **Accelerated Courses** – some students are a year ahead in math
- **Summer School** – upgrade or get ahead (Registration opens May 1)
- **Language Challenge Exams** – Mandarin 11 & 12, Korean 11 & 12, Spanish 11 & 12

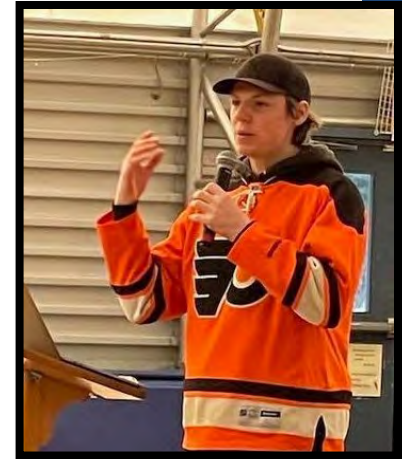

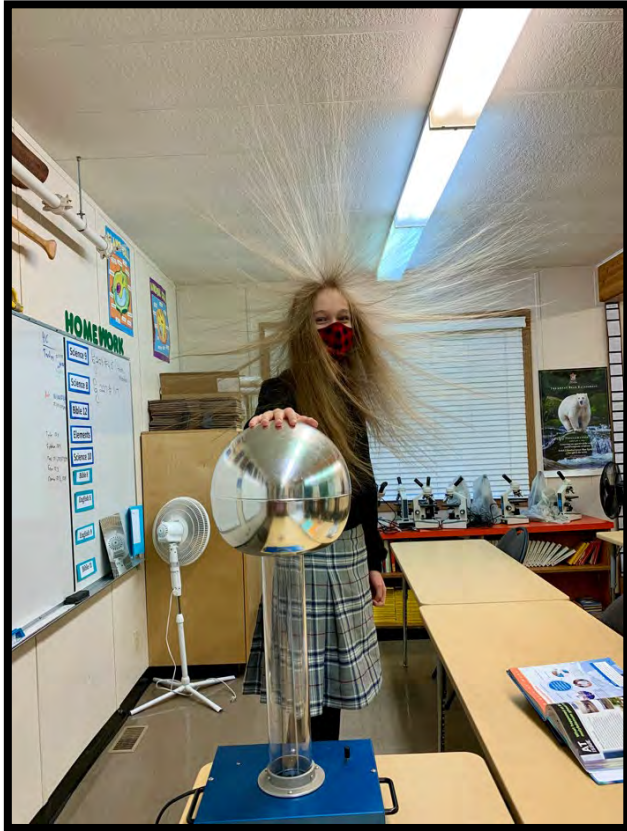

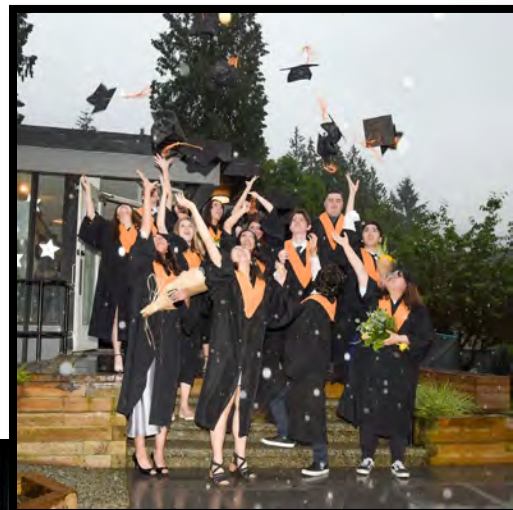
