

80 credits

(1 course = 4 credits)

- 2. **Post Secondary Plans** The courses chosen in Grade 10, 11 & 12 will impact post secondary plans
- 3. **Elective Options at LGCA** Course selection options depend on post secondary plans
 - Our timetable is designed around what our students need so it is important to choose carefully

Admission Requirements

Broad-based admission trend.

- Personal Profile (UBC)
- Supplemental applications
- Portfolios
- Interviews/Auditions
- Reference letters: leadership, school & community service

Students need to demonstrate reflective and engaged learning

 Course load as well as diversity is important (An LGCA graduate will have well beyond the minimum 80 credits)

- Potentially earn an extra four credits towards transcript and may be able to enroll directly into the second year course at university.
